On Saturday the 20th of August, beginning at 7:30 pm, the World War II Fighter flown by the Tuskegee Airmen lands at the Gary Aquatorium! At 28 feet long and 28 feet wide, it's twice the size of the glider on the west end of the building. It will be on a pole 35 feet high on the east end of the building.

### Celebration!

In addition to hoisting the Mustang fighter in place, August 20th is our 26th annual meeting/event/fundraiser. So here's the rundown:

7:15 pm – doors open, tickets are \$50, \$75, \$100 or your age. You chose. All but the first \$10 of your ticket is tax deductible. All funds raised will be used for the completion of the Mustang and for further improvements on the building.

7:30 pm – dinner is served. Hot dogs, hamburgers, tacos and gyros (chicken or sausage) all made by Manny of Houston, Texas and "the big salad" from Flamingo Pizzeria. There will be beer, wine, pop and cold water.

8:30 pm - short business meeting and election of new board.

8:33 pm – spotlight is turned on to Mustang fighter, 97 year old Tuskegee Airman, Robert Martin, says a few words and dedicates the Mustang. The Mustang fighter is painted exactly as Mr. Martin's was in World War II. Mr. Martin flew 46 missions, was shot down over Yugoslavia and lived to tell about it, and will tell you about it on August 20, 2016. At the conclusion of his remarks, a tarpaulin placed over the center of the cockpit will be removed and the plane will be officially dedicated as a permanent part of the Aquatorium display.

#### WHAT DOES IT COST ANYWAY?

Titan Aircraft of Ohio built the plane at a cost of \$30,000. The superstructure that holds it up is designed to withstand winds of at least 135 miles per hour. It's not going anywhere. However, that superstructure is going to cost us at least \$30,000, perhaps more. There are \$2,000 is shipping costs, \$4,500 in painting costs and \$5,000 for erection for the plane on the pole.

That comes to \$71,500. So far we have spent \$35,000 and we have about \$30,000 left in the account. Your participation at the annual event and your purchase of space on the placard that we will put up later are the key to putting us over the top.
